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A MESSAGE FROM THE MINISTER

When I was younger I don't recall Advent and Christmas being so busy! I remember the wonderful get-togethers with family and friends, the excitement and anticipation of Christmas morning and the lazy days of the school break in between, but I don't remember feeling anxious about all the "to do" and "needs to get done" lists. I am sure they existed!! My parents probably felt that stress and just did a good job of not showing it.

Upon reflection there is something special about the care-free childhood Christmases gone by. Now there seems to be all kinds of things that pull on our time, whether it is for business or pleasure! Having good time-management skills helps in this department, as I like to get things like services done well in advance, which allows me to be a little more spontaneous with other events over the season.

We also seem to talk a lot more about self-care than we ever did. There is an acknowledgement that taking time for ourselves is not a selfish thing, but rather an important part of healthy living. Any self-care guide will tell you that "giving yourself permission" is one of the most important steps in self-care.

What this means is that you give yourself permission to say yes or no to whatever is being asked of you. In many ways this is good advice, but let's be honest, we often don't feel we can say yes or no to a particular request because this time of year is driven by traditions. If we say no to a particular request we might feel guilty that we are giving up on a tradition. Probably one of the best pieces of advice is "do things in moderation". And this advice is not simply related to the food or drink at this time of year but for all things. Moderation, however, is not as easy as simply watching what we consume!

I have been thinking more deeply on the importance of self-care during a busy season like advent, and have realized that sometimes the best self-care happens when we are supporting each other. Here are some words of advice for you over the season. Let us care for one another! It seems simple enough, but what I am really suggesting is that we as a congregation try to find a way to balance all of our traditions, tasks, and responsibilities by offering to help where we can.

Perhaps it is by encouraging the upcoming Advent Bible Study or volunteering at the Joy to the World weekend. We will be looking for helpers to assist with the Christmas Tea or lead something at our Christmas Eve service. The more we support one another the less burdened others may feel by the various tasks and traditions. And the season is a lot more fun when we do things together. This is a gifted and talented congregation, and all these events and opportunities are our gift to the community.

Here are a few opportunities for us to participate in the anticipation of advent and take moments to care for ourselves during a very busy season.

Guess Who's Coming to Supper Nov. 24th at 6 pm: Join Pastoral Care in this fun event! You are invited to sign up as either a host (listing how many you could host) or a guest. Then guests are randomly matched with hosts and told on the day of the event where they will be going. Hosts will only know how many to expect a few days before. Guests will arrive for an informal supper at 6 pm at the host's house. This is a great way to get to know people in our congregation!

A Christmas Carol: Advent Bible Study: We will use Charles Dickens' classic tale to help us tell and hear the Advent story in a way that helps us experience it. Advent Communion on Sunday Dec 3rd. Begin the season of Advent with communion at our regular Sunday service.

This year our congregation will host our fourth display of Nativity Sets (also known as crèches) from around the globe as our Christmas gift to the Comox Valley. We've been calling this event "Joy to the World" but this year the poster is headlined "Nativity: Crèches of the World" for clearer communication with the public, with whom it has been very well-received.

Last year, the event featured over 200 crèches, live music, a dark room with lighted sets, children's activities, and a special afternoon for people with mobility issues, including light refreshments. 
